What do we grow in Norfolk?

What do you need to make pancakes?

Where do the ingredients for pancakes come from?

Where do the ingredients for pizzas come from?

We will be exploring and answering these questions through stories, pictures, music, art, cooking and eating! The children will be setting up a pancake café where they will be cooking and serving pancakes to one another.

We will learn about Easter, new life, the symbolism of the cross and some of the stories which Jesus told. There will also be a whole school Easter service. (Date in the diary attached to the flyer)



After half term we hope to incubate some hen's eggs.
