Welcome from your Chair of Governors.

Dear Parents/Carers

This is my first Governor's newsletter since I took over as chair of the governing body. Hopefully I will have met quite a few of you when I have been visiting our schools.

I am very proud to be leading a strong committed governing board, who are pleased to support a dedicated team of staff at both schools. You will all be aware that both schools have had recent rigorous Ofsted inspections and have been graded as Good.

Although we put a lot of emphasis on results, as Church Schools we balance this with the whole development of your children. We are very focused on your children's safety and happiness whilst at school and monitor their learning and wellbeing during periodic visits to the schools. A fellow governor has produced a report for you to explain this a bit more.

As governors, we are also charged with ensuring that all money is spent effectively educating your children as well as maintaining and improving the buildings and facilities at the schools. Both schools have seen exciting building developments which we are pleased to say are paid off and we are now hoping to improve yet further the buildings at Morley. Many of you will have seen the literature advertising my Open Garden in June to raise funds for our schools. I look forward to seeing many of you there. We are also looking at using our outside facilities even more and at present have a member of staff undergoing training to become a Forest Schools Instructor. We plan to provide Forest School sessions at both of our schools next year.

Mrs Green has introduced the Parent Forums. We really appreciate the feedback from these and are pleased to say that a lot of the points raised have been

acted upon. For example: we created a homework leaflet to give parents information and advice on this important topic; we have listened to your suggestions about our rewards system and implemented changes; parking is an ongoing issue but we continue to respond to suggestions for improvements where we can; parents asked us to continue to email the link for our Friday newsletters which we are doing; we have explored other options for school photographs following feedback from parents. These are just a few of the matters that have been expedited following your feedback at Parent Forum meetings.

In the not too distant future, we will see Wymondham College open its doors to primary school age children. The opening of this school is part of a local plan to provide much needed school places following the large increase in house building in the Wymondham area. Morley Primary School will continue to provide a small, village Church school ethos for those parents who choose this for their children.

Finally, I would like to say a massive thank you to FOTS; FOMPS and our team of volunteers. Your unstinting dedication and support for our schools is very much appreciated. I would urge other parents/carers to put themselves forward to help in any way that they can.

Another build at Morley?

Victorian village schools are not the ideal shape and size to accommodate the needs of a primary school in the 21st century. Because of this, over the past ten years, both schools have engaged in some ambitious and transformative building projects. We have learned from these experiences that the drain on our energy and time and funds, as well as the disruption caused by the building work itself, are quickly forgotten and are far outweighed by the positive benefits of the new spaces and learning environments we create.

Our current hopes and plans are for us to be successful in securing, via the Diocese of Norwich and DfE funding, the support and finance to transform some remaining areas of Morley school. At Morley we need a new staff room that is:

- 1) **On the ground floor.** This will mean that:
 - Outside of lesson times staff are more accessible to pupils if there is a problem that can't be resolved by our Midday Supervisors, or if they just need time for a quiet and confidential chat with their teacher.
 - Staff will be able to enjoy their break and lunchtimes but still be able to visually monitor some of the activity in school, when children are in the care of MSAs
 - Staff, visitors and pupils who are wheelchair users will be able to access a ground floor staff room

- 2) A bigger room:**

- Our staff numbers at Morley have been gradually growing as our pupil numbers have risen. Staff are currently over-crowded in a rather dingy room and have little space in which to work away from noise and distractions. Staff well-being is incredibly important and, as a Church school federation, we want staff to feel valued. We also want to provide facilities that will attract and retain quality staff for the benefit of our children's education.



What else?

Any restructuring and building work at Morley will also give us the opportunity to make best use of any space that is freed up; this could include rethinking the areas set aside for: nurture, first aid, small group work, music tuition, meetings with parents and advisors.

What can you do to help?

Through securing grants from charitable organisations, we have previously raised tens of thousands of pounds to provide the 10% of building costs that CEVA schools are required to contribute to any agreed building project. We have also supplemented these grants with fund-raising activities such as: auctions, raffles, hamper squares, ticket-entry social events.

- Look out for up-coming events and fund-raising activities to help our build fund
- Come to the open garden at the Old Rectory, Morley on June 16th - hosted by Robert, our Chair of Governors – in aid of our building fund
- Let us know if you have expertise and enthusiasm for big-scale fund-raising and would like to help our planning of events.

Since setting up the Parent Forum in May 2017, it has been a pleasure to meet parents every term for the purpose of making improvements to our schools.

Discussions have been thought provoking and, at times, lively! Overall, the meetings have enabled school and parents to forge a stronger link with each other and build on our community cohesion.

Some of the issues that we have addressed at the Forum have been:

Here are a few of the changes we have made, as a result of parents/carers sharing their feedback with us:

- Introduced ‘Come Dine With Me’ – giving parents the opportunity to come into school and share a lunch time with the children
- Organised open mornings so that parents can see what school life is like for their children
- Improved communications – parents made us aware that they preferred an email alert for the Friday newsletter, so this was reinstated
- Improved safety outside Morley Primary by establishing the cone barrier at drop off and pick up times
- Developed a new homework policy and leaflet for parents
- Changed our photographers to improve the quality and style of annual photographs


PE & Sports Premium


Below are the latest pie charts showing how our two schools have spent their sports premium funding over the last year from April 2018 – March 2019.


The governing body at present comes from all walks of life and are of all ages. We have full time working governors, part-time working governors, parent governors and governors who are grand parents of children at our schools.
