Our **PSHE** provision aims to develop the knowledge, skills and attributes that children need to manage their lives, now and in the future. It helps children and young people to stay healthy and safe, while preparing them to make the most of life and work. **RSE** 

We want young people to flourish and to gain every opportunity to live fulfilling lives. For Church schools, RSE is about the emotional, social and physical aspects of growing up, healthy relationships, sex, human sexuality and sexual health. It is also about the spiritual and moral aspects of relationships within a context of a Christian vision for the purpose of life.

#### Teaching

Teaching is non-biased, factually correct and positively inclusive.

We acknowledge and address children's current experiences and prepare them for their future.

Teaching is flexible and reactive. Content is made relevant to the children's real lives, assessed and adapted as their needs change.

Our curriculum is spiral in nature. It develops knowledge, skills and attributes, where prior learning is revisited, reinforced and extended year on year.

## **Promoting Pupil voice**
