

Music: Learning songs to perform at the Easter Service and Music Assembly.

We will explore and comment on music from around the world that they listen to and will comment on the effectiveness of their own and others' work.

We will continue our understanding of music notation as well as working on improvisation skills.

Geography:

Locating countries and oceans of the world.

We will be exploring different countries, looking at both human and physical geography and think about how the climate changes around the world.

Using globes and atlases we will explore capital cities of countries and what the landscapes across different continents look like. From polar regions, to the different types of rainforests.

Science: A world of living things

Looking at what an ecosystem, community and habitat are and the differences between them.


Classifying animals and understanding what producers and consumers are, predators and prey.

In French, children will be learning the names for subjects and equipment at school.


PE:
