Celebrations include:</p> <p>Special food or drink Wearing special clothes Giving gifts or cards Dancing or drama Remembering something or someone important</p>
<p>Enhanced Classroom Provision:</p> <p>Book area to investigate - children's stories of different celebrations, birthday cards and cards for other celebrations to decorate e.g. Eid ul Fitr, Chinese new year etc Writing/mark-making - making cards, writing shopping lists for food to buy, planning a party ICT/technology taking pictures of celebrations Role play dressing up in special clothes Playdough - to make special food Small world area - retelling the story of the animals crossing the river in Chinese new year, the story of Rama and Sita Creative area making invitations, decorations, cards, Chinese lanterns, diva lamps Listening corner - listening to stories of celebrations, singing celebration songs</p>		<p>Key connections:</p> <p>What do we celebrate?
