Key Knowledge

Children will learn:

- The changes which occur during puberty
- To consider different attitudes and values around gender stereotyping and sexuality and consider their origin and impact
- Values that are important to them in relationships and to appreciate the importance of friendship in intimate relationships
- Human reproduction in the context of the human lifecycle
- How a baby is made and grows (conception and pregnancy)
- The roles and responsibilities of carers and parents
- To ask questions about sex and relationships with confidence, where to find support and advice when they need it
- That contraception can be used to stop a baby from being conceived

Vocabulary

Puberty - the time during which adolescents reach sexual maturity and become capable of reproduction

Gender - male or female

Stereotyping – a mistaken idea or belief many people have about a thing

Media – the channels through which we get news, music, movies, education, promotional messages and other data

Relationships – the way in which two or more people or groups regard or behave towards each other

Intimate - closely acquainted, familiar

Sexuality - capacity for sexual feelings

List of words for labelling the male and female reproductive organs (see scheme)

Conception - the action of conceiving a child

Pregnancy - the condition or period of being pregnant

Parent -a person's father or mother

Carer - a family member or paid helper who regularly looks after a child, sick, elderly or disabled person

Contraception -the deliberate use of artificial methods to prevent pregnancy
