### Key Knowledge

People who have moved from other places (including the experience of refugees

- Understand what migration means

Human rights and the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child

- How the rights are relevant to their lives and that rights come with responsibilities

- Identify some of the organisations that represent and support the rights of the child and the difference they make

#### Homelessness

- What makes a place where someone lives a home
- To appreciate the difficulties of being homeless or living in temporary accommodation
- Know about organisations and initiatives (including charities) that work with the homeless or people living in temporary accommodation

## Vocabulary

Migrate – move from one part of something to another

**Refugee** – a person who has been forced to leave their country in order to escape war, persecution or natural disaster

**Persecution** – ill treatment due to a person's beliefs

**War** – armed conflict between different countries or different groups within a country

Rights – an entitlement to have or do something

**Responsibilities** – an opportunity to act independently and take discussions without authorisation

**Human rights** – a right which is believed to belong to each person

**Organisation** – a group of people with a particular purpose

**Homelessness** – the state of having no home

**Temporary**- lasting for only a limited period of time, not permanent

**Accommodation** -a room, group of rooms or building in which someone may live or stay
