A Message from Mr Carlyle

With one more week to go before half term, I'm struck by how quickly this term is progressing. The children are very much into the rhythm and flow of their learning and I have seen a number of fantastic pieces of work over the last few days. It's always a pleasure to give someone a 'headteacher's award' sticker and to hear them talk about what they have been doing.

Many thanks to those of you who have signed up for the parents' consultation evenings for the week after half term. Hopefully this will provide a useful insight into some of the areas of the curriculum that they children have been studying and will provoke conversations at home with your children. Talking about their learning is a really effective way for the children to recall key pieces of knowledge, which in turn will be valuable for future lessons.

The attendance at Tacolneston for this academic year so far is 96%. Having high attendance is a key predictor of positive academic outcomes and this is borne out in the data at a national level. For the last academic year, looking at outcomes across the country, pupils at the end of key stage 1 (year 2) were far more likely to have achieved the expected standard for children of their age in reading, writing and maths if their attendance was close to 100%. The data shows us that 68% of children achieved the expected standard in reading, writing and maths if their attendance was either 99% or 100% for the year. This drops to 56% achieving all three if their attendance was 95%. If the attendance was 90% then only 46% of children achieved the expected standard in reading, writing and maths.

There is a similar picture at the end of year 6.71% of children nationally achieved the expected standard in reading, writing and maths where their attendance was 99% or 100%. Where the attendance was 95% for the year then the percentage achieving the expected standard was 61% and for 90% attendance attainment in all three areas fell to 48%. Outcomes for year 6 are an indicator of potential results at GCSE too, so it is vital that we all work together to ensure that our attendance figures are as good they can possibly be.





FREE Dental Screening , for Children Under 5

What is Dental Screening?

Dental screening is an oral examination of children, taking around 3 minutes, to check the tooth surfaces for decay. Dental reports are provided to parents with information regarding their child's oral health and notifying them about any treatment needs of their child, it aims to identify oral health concerns at an early stage and prompt parents and carers to seek treatment where required.

What happens if my child has a dental problem?

If an urgent dental condition is detected in your child's mouth, you will receive a follow up appointment and the required treatment. You will be contacted by phone a few days after the screening date.





What about NHS registration?

Dental screening is offered to all children, whether or not they are registered with an NHS Dentist.

For children who are registered with an NHS Dentist and require follow-up treatment, it will be suggested that you share the report with your own dentist to access treatment.

For children who are **not** registered with an NHS Dentist, follow-up treatment will be offered free of charge - however, this does not mean that your child will become a registered patient with e practice where treatment is completed.
