Our discussion focussed on issues under Academy Improvement including pupil attainment, attendance, behaviour, safeguarding and progress against the Academy Improvement and Development Plan (AIDP). Finally we expressed our gratitude to Mr Carlyle for his invaluable input over the last two terms. He has been with us only for a short time but he has provided a very smooth transition and has put in place many new initiatives on which we can all build over the rest of this school year.

We have a Governor's meeting every half-term and our next meeting is on 13th February 2024.
