Message from Mr Phoenix

This week has seen some changes I have introduced to improve children's experience at playtimes and lunchtimes. Firstly, having seen how well the children play together and lovely examples of older children looking out for younger children on the playgrounds, we are trialling free-flow use of the wooden play equipment. So, as long as it is not wet or slippery, any children may use the wooden climbing equipment at any time during playtime and lunchtime. We have adults supervising, and I have already been able to observe the children playing considerately and responsibly on the equipment, watching out for each other and making sure there is safe space to play.

Secondly, I have introduced a new lunchtime prayer. The aim of this is to ensure the children come into the dining hall in a quiet and orderly way ready to share in the lunchtime prayer together as a whole school before being served their meals. Lunchtime is a really important part of every child's day, so I composed the prayer to help the children think about the value of both food and friendship as well as the importance of being thankful for what we have.

The prayer is:

Dear Lord, Thank You for bringing us together today Please bless this time as we eat and play. May our food nourish us and our friendships enrich how we live, Help us to be thankful for all that You give. Amen

My other challenge for the children this week has been for them to respond as quickly as they can to our whole-school signal for quiet and attention. The signal has been established a long time, and is a member of staff raising their hand, with children responding by doing the same while being quiet and listening. Having a refreshed focus on the signal this week has enabled some classes to get super fast at responding! It is really helpful to have a signal common to the whole school as it enables any member of staff to gain everyone's attention whenever this is needed.

There has been lots of great learning taking place this week. I have seen some wonderful art and design work, with children taking a real pride in art techniques and their sketchbooks. Have a look on the website 'Latest News' for some art examples from Eagles and Sparrowhawks classes. We also had a group of visiting teachers to Tacolneston, to come and see Maths Mastery teaching in action. They took away lots of notes and ideas, and it is great to be able to share the good practice going on in our school with a wider professional audience.

I must also say 'well done' to our group of children from Y2, Y3 and Y4 who took part in the 'Spirit of the Games' sporting event at the UEA this week. They came back very enthusiastic about the activities they had done - which included archery, basketball, curling and various athletic and team games.

- Textile off cuts, yarns or threaded material


We are looking forward to hosting our valentines disco on 15th February, keep an eye on school bags for ticket slips, posters will go up next week.
