Message from Mr Phoenix

It has been a very busy week at Tacolneston this week!

Tuesday was Safer Internet Day, and we have been reflecting in Collective Worship this week on the importance of the things we say and do, and how our words and actions impact other people. Just as in day-to-day life, it is equally important for us all to be positive and kind in the way we interact online. This week, some of our older children joined with their peers from Morley to visit the Norfolk Records Office, as part of a project centred on history and heritage at Deopham church. The Records Office staff were impressed by the engagement and interest the children had, and their skills in piecing together what life was like, from maps, census data, records and a school log book. Because of the level of maturity and respect the children showed, the staff were able to trust them to handle and look first-hand at actual historic documents, which is a great privilege.

Also this week, our infant children visited the Norwich Synagogue as part of their RE learning. The synagogue volunteers who showed them round were really impressed with the children's behaviour and their prior knowledge about Judaism. The children loved experiencing the atmosphere in the synagogue, the scrolls and tasting shabbat food!

It's not just the children but our teachers and support staff have been extra busy this week too! In staff training evenings, all staff have been working with colleagues in school and across St Benet's Trust to share best practice in teaching and learning. We have been exploring strategies to check that children really understand what they have been taught, to ensure there is support in place to help everyone reach their goals, and how sharing examples of work can inspire and challenge children in their own learning.

It's great to have such a committed staff and expertise we can share as well as new ideas to learn and explore. Thank you also for your commitment to school as parents. One indicator of that commitment to education is children's attendance, which currently stands at 94% over this academic year to date. In the 1860s school logbook we saw at the Record Office, the headteacher wrote one week "Everything is in perfect order, with attendance at 93%". I'm not sure 93% attendance is 'perfect' but attendance is important and let's keep it up - and keep our attendance better than the Victorians!
