Message from Mr Phoenix

We have had a great start to the new half term in school. I hope you were able to enjoy the half term holiday week.

This week we have begun a new Collective Worship series on Lent. We thought about celebrations, linked to the story of Palm Sunday, and considered what we do to celebrate and share in happy times with others. We have also begun to learn some Easter songs in readiness for our whole-school Easter service which will be coming up in a few weeks' time.

I have enjoyed reading some great examples of extended writing this week. Having the opportunity to write at length is something many of our children really enjoy, and their ability to craft their language for effect and to captivate the reader is very impressive. The 'Author of the Week' book which we share in Friday Celebration Assemblies is full of superb examples of children writing with alliteration, description, powerful words and carefully constructed grammar to create dramatic, atmospheric and persuasive pieces.

During Celebration Assembly today, in addition to the usual awards and certificates, we have recognised the achievement of all those children who have been awarded their Gold Paths card this week. As part of our behaviour policy, all children have a set of Paths Cards in class. These normally show Green but can be changed to Orange, Red or White if behaviour is not as expected. However, teachers can also change these to Gold for a child making outstanding effort, showing exemplary behaviour or going out of their way to do something really special in class. We wanted to acknowledge these Golds with the whole school, and be able to communicate the achievement with parents, so each week Gold Paths awards now feature in Friday assembly and on the newsletter. Well done to all our 'Gold' children this week!

Next week is World Book Day on Thursday, when children (and staff!) are invited to dress as a favourite book character. Throughout the week, we will have other activities linked to books, reading and authors. Here at Tacolneston, there is a long-standing link with author and illustrator James Mayhew. The children will be looking at the work he has done at the school, and learning more about James and his links to art and music.
