Message from Mr Phoenix

This week I have been pleased to welcome our team of school Governors into Taconleston for a full day of whole-school review. Together we visited lessons in the different classes, reviewed work in children's books, met with children and committees and spoke with staff. This identified many strengths of the school, including the quality of writing across the curriculum, the benefit of cross-curricular links in deepening learning and the school's Christian values being reflected in behaviour and attitudes around school.

We also identified areas we will be focusing attention on going forward. One of these is the value we have seen children place on practical hands-on experiences, and the evidence of this making learning meaningful, relevant and memorable. We will be looking at ways to develop more active learning in coming weeks to enrich the children's learning experience across the Tacolneston curriculum.

A great example of learning through first-hand activities is the Easter Experience all children took part in today. The Raise Kidswork team literally took over the school with exciting immersive experiences to enable the children to understand and explore the different parts of the Easter story. Thinking about concepts such as sharing through a 'last supper' experience, and who we can stand up for in a 'Gethsemane' garden, really made the Easter story relevant to the children's own lives as well as being memorable.

Sparrowhawks Duxford Trip

We would like to thank FOTS for paying for the coach for this trip.

Our coach pulled out of the car park at 08:30, reaching Duxford at 10. The visit commenced with a tour of the 101 prototype Concord, which still holds the World Record for the fastest passenger jet and the quickest journey time - London to New York.

However, our main focus for the day was the WWII planes and the Battle of Britain. We got to see Spitfires, Hurricanes, Messerscmitzs, a fragmented Japanese Zero - one of type used at Pearl Harbor. The children also got to experience sitting in a cockpit, an Anderson Shelter and close up viewing of searchlights, anti-aircraft guns and the Barnes Wallace bouncing bomb.

The children were able to experience an audio re-enactment of a Battle of Britain scrambled response, as would have happened at Duxford. It was played out in the actual control room used during the war.


Our day finished in the American hanger after the class respectfully walked past the thought provoking memorial built to honour all of the America crews lost in the war.
